## Why can the process take many months/years?

Law and policy is complicated:

- Common law duty of confidentiality
- UK General Data Protection Regulation
- The Mental Capacity Act 2005
- Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007
- UK Clinical Trials Regulations
- The Health Service (Control of Patient Information) Regulations 2002
- The Care Act 2014
- Health and Social Care Act 2012
- The National Data Opt-out policy

#### Why can the process take months/years?

Data providers have competing demands in terms of maintaining public confidence, safeguarding confidentiality and enabling research.

There are multiple application steps and not all bodies may agree on interpretation of the law/policy/guidance.

Some data applicants have more institutional support than others.

#### Final points

Patients can make a difference at every step of the research journey.

Funding bodies and Research Ethics Committees need patient/public members.

The Independent Group Advising on the Release of Data is planning to recruit later this year.
