

Webinar: Uncharted territory - using patient data to tackle COVID-19

The next use MY data event will take the form of a virtual meeting with a focus on how the use of patient data has changed amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

We are currently in uncharted territory with changes happening rapidly within the health data landscape. Although the COVID-19 pandemic has seen a significant focus on data, it has also raised a number of important questions about the sharing and use of data as well as highlighting the challenges that are associated with the use of data.

We have invited three speakers to talk us through what is happening and what the future opportunities and challenges are. There will plenty of opportunity for you to raise questions and includes time for a Q&A session:

- How has the use of data changed since COVID-19?

 Natalie Banner from Understanding Patient Data will talk to us about what is different about the way data is being handled and what positive changes have been made.
- How engaged have patients been in this?
 Paul Charlton, use MY data Advisory Group member, will examine the changes from a patient's perspective. What do these changes mean? Do I understand the changes and what challenges do I think we face? Have these been communicated effectively?
- Future Opportunities and Challenges.

 James Peach from DATA-CAN, the Health Data Research Hub for Cancer, will talk about what potential opportunities will arise for researchers accessing this data, focusing on how the data could be used and what the collateral harms are.

The event is aimed at patients, relatives and carers, the public and professionals and is open to all who are interested and is free to join.
